

## Spring Clean-Up 2009

Spring Clean-Up in Chattahoochee Hills was a multi-day event this year.

On Saturday, April 11, the Adopt-a-Mile Committee took advantage of the Bulk Trash Amnesty Day, sponsored by Fulton County, to clean up illegal dumps around the city.

Sixteen volunteers worked in teams to clean up 10 dumps along the following roads: Capps Ferry, Cochran Mill Rd, Garretts Ferry, Jenkins Rd, Sardis Rd, Rico Tatum Rd, Upper Wooten Rd, and Hwy 70.

On Saturday, April 18, volunteers from Firestone Complete Auto Care worked with the City Public Safety Department to clean-up and dispose of approximately 1,800-2,000 tires.

At the same time, 28 volunteers participated in the Clean-Up Day hosted by the Adopt-a-Mile Committee and sponsored by Cardinal Sanitation. The volunteers walked 16 miles and picked up 197 bags of trash, including 116 trash bags and 81 bags of recyclable materials.
